Brookings School District REQUEST FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL INTRA-DISTRICT TRANSFER

- 2. Applications from **district residents will have preference** over open-enrollment requests.
- 3. Parent or legal guardian must complete and return this form to the district office.
- 4. Administration will act upon requests and notify the applicant no earlier than August 1st.
